QUILTED COMFORTER COVER

Size: 120 x 180 cm (47" x 71")

You Need:

- 500 cm (5 1/2 yds), light grey cotton satin.
- 120 cm (1 3/8 yds), dark gray cotton satin)
- 200 cm (79"),batting (110 cm width)
- Matching sewing thread in light and dark grey.
- Matching embroidery thread in crème.
- Embroidery needle
- 8 grey buttons
- Button hole foot
- Fabric marker
- Marking paper
- Safety pins
- Quilting guide

All the fabric has the width 150 cm

1 Template

You will find the full-sized pattern for the quilting lines on the pattern sheet.

Print it out and put it together as illustrated.

(Please be sure that your printer does not automatically adjust the size to the paper).

Printer setting should be set for A4 size paper and Page Scaling: None.

Trace the quilting lines into the marking paper.

2 Cutting

Dark gray:

- Cut 6 pieces for the quilted top, each 36 cm x 66 cm (14 1/8" x 26"), including 3 cm (1 1/4") seam allowances

Light gray:

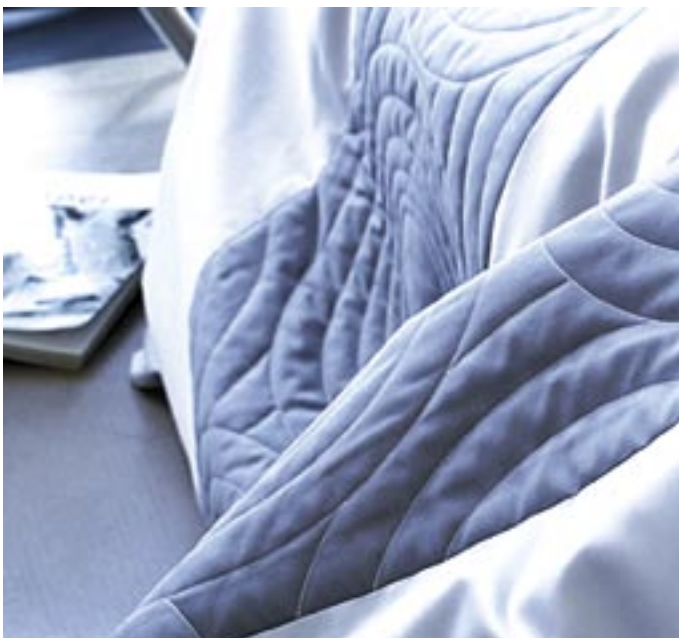
- Cut 6 pieces for the quilted top, each 33 cm x 63cm (13" x 24 3/4")
- Cut 1 piece, 180 x 123 cm (71" x 49 1/2") as backing for the quilted top
- Cut 1 piece, 180 x 123 cm (71" x 49 1/2 ") for back
- All measurements include 1.5 cm (5/8") seam allowances

Batting:

- Cut 6 pieces, each 36 cm x 66 cm (14 1/8" x 26"), including 3 cm (1 1/4") seam allowances

3 Quilting

- First cut out the inner circle and the two inner half-circles from the template.
- Lay the template on one of the dark gray fabric rectangles. Use the fabric marker to draw the inner circles.
- Remove the template. Lay the dark gray fabric rectangle on one of the batting rectangles. Use the safety pins to secure the layers together.
- Thread your sewing machine with crème embroidery thread in the top and bobbin.
- Select straight stitch, length 2.5 mm.
- Start to stitch the inner circle.
- Make sure that the last stitch of the circle meets the first stitch as exactly as possible.
- Pull threads to the wrong side and knot them securely.
- Now select the quilting guide from your sewing machine's accessories and attach it to your sewing machine. Stitch 5 more circles parallel to the first circle, spacing them as indicated in the pattern.
- Quilt the circles on the 6 dark gray fabric rectangles in the same manner.
- Now cut the curves from the edges of the template. Use the fabric marker to draw the curves on each dark gray rectangle, making sure that they are positioned correctly in relation to the quilted circles.
- Stitch the curves.



4 Sewing

- Cut each gray rectangle to 33 x 63 cm (13" x 24 3/4") (including 1.5 cm (5/8") seam allowances).
- Stitch together alternately 3 light gray rectangles and 3 dark gray rectangles, along their long edges, to make a strip. Repeat with the remaining fabric rectangles. Carefully press all seams open.
- Stitch the two resulting strips together along one long edge. Make sure that the seams between rectangles match exactly.
- Carefully press the seam open.
- Lay the resulting pieced rectangle on the light gray backing piece, right side together; stitch one of the short sides. Turn it inside out and press carefully
- Lay the resulting pieced rectangle on the light gray backing piece, wrong sides facing. Baste the three edges together.
- Lay the light gray back piece on the pieced top, right sides facing. Sew around the three sides.
- Finish edges of seam allowances.
- Fold down a hem on the light gray back fabric, stitch it in place.
- Measure out for 8 buttonholes, the first starts 10 cm from the edge.
- Thread your sewing machine with grey sewing thread in the top and bobbin.
- Attach the buttonhole foot, sew the buttonholes in place.
- Measure out for the buttons, sew them in place.
