

Tips for creative vision Coat

Pattern

Use your favorite coat pattern and make the following pattern changes:

1. Extend the collar twice the original size.
2. Make cuff on sleeve 11" (28cm) wide with embroidery and adjust the sleeve length.
3. Waist Insertion 8" (20cm) wide with embroidery and adjust coat pattern accordingly.

Embroidering on heavy fabric

- Use an embroidery needle, size 90
- To ensure proper placement of the embroidery on your garment, embroider the fabric first, then cut out the pieces from your pattern.
- Always test your embroidery with the actual fabric, stabilizer and threads you will be using before starting your project.
- Hoop the fabric with water soluble stabilizer on top and tear-away stabilizer underneath.
- When finished embroidering, cut away the excess stabilizer around the design. Rinse in lukewarm water or according to manufacturer's instructions.
- The embroideries on the coat are customized, resized and combined on the PFAFF® creative vision™ HD screen. The embroideries are created in the software of the machine. See screen captures.

Interfacing

When making tailored garments, interfacing is the key to obtaining professional results. There are many different kinds of stabilizer available today, both fusible and sew-in. For best results, you should select an interfacing that is slightly lighter weight than your fashion fabric. To ensure that your garment retains its shape, apply interfacing on the whole front piece, the upper collar and all hems.

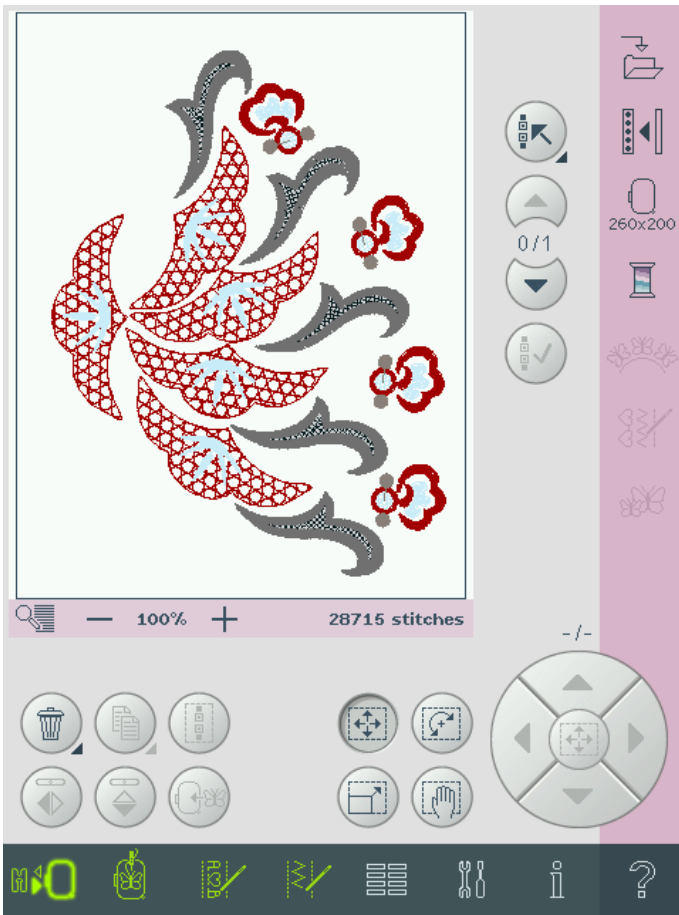
Tip: Follow the manufacturer's instructions for fusing the interfacing to the fabric. Holding the iron still for the recommended time will ensure a permanent bond.

Embellishment

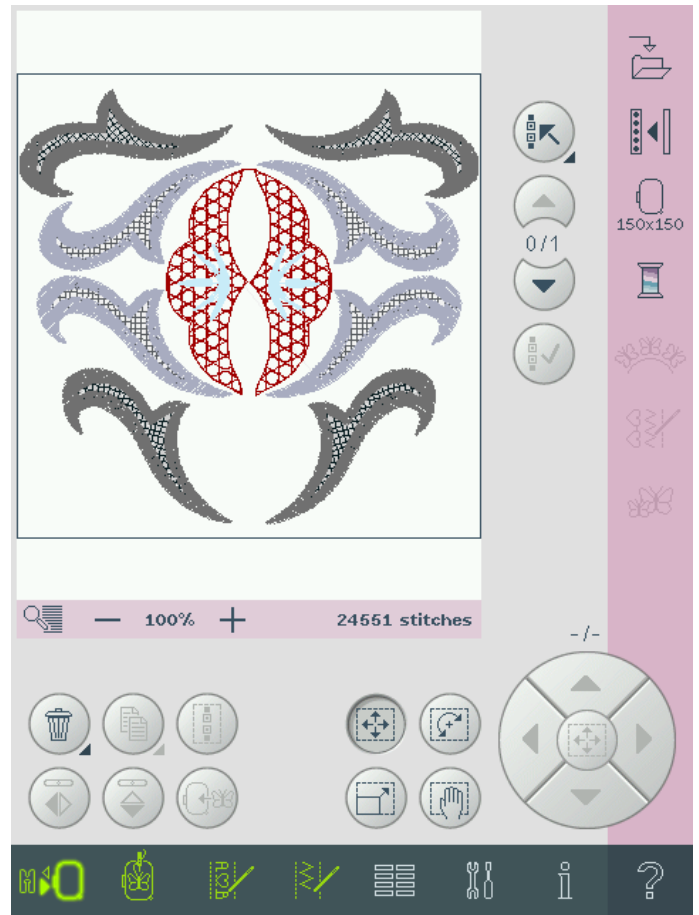
Add beads and sequin trim on the collar to achieve an elegant and personal touch to the coat. See picture.



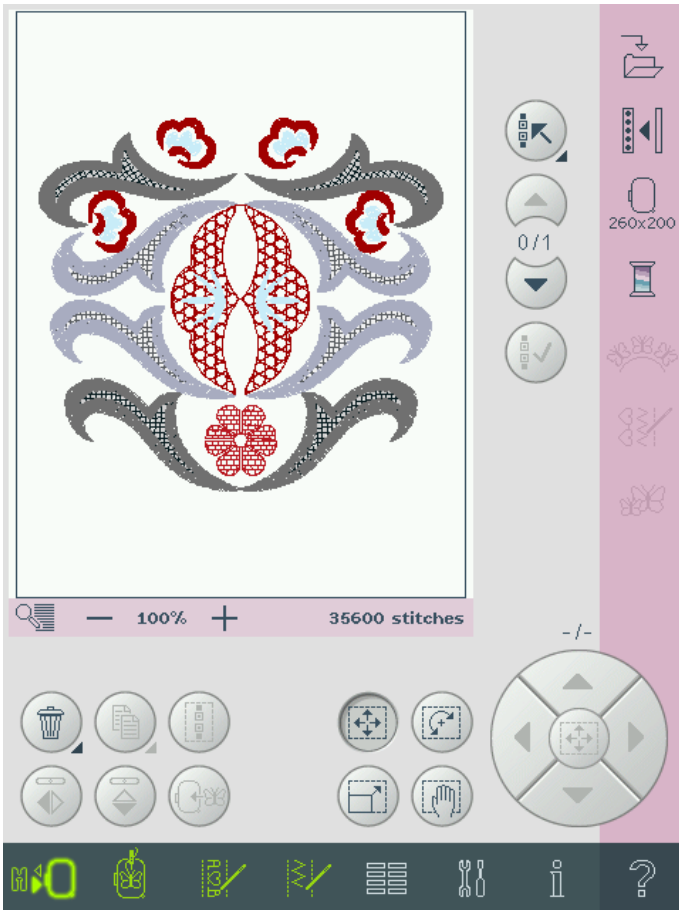
Collar
