

Pink Jersey Scarf

Size of Scarf:

15 x 220 cm (6" x 86")

Materials:

- PFAFF® overlock/serger
- 40 x 120 cm (16" x 48") fine pink jersey fabric
- Serger thread, 3 each in matching pink and a contrasting color
- 1 Embroidery thread and 2 sewing threads in a second contrasting color
- 1 Water soluble marker
- Ruler



Cutting:

- 2 strips, each 15 x 110 cm (6" x 44")

Instructions:

- Lay jersey strips together, wrong sides facing. Stitch together on one narrow edge with a 2-thread flatlock stitch, using matching serger thread. Pull seam flat.
- Now use water soluble marker to draw 4 lines at one narrow edge. Draw these line parallel to the narrow edge and spaced 5 cm (2") apart.
- Thread the looper with contrasting machine embroidery thread and use the matching sewing thread as the upper thread.
- Fold the fabric strip along the 1st line, wrong side facing in. Stitch along the fold edge with the 2-thread flatlock stitch, running the fold edge of the fabric past the upper knife so that the fabric is not cut.
- **Tip!** To make this seam more decorative, select a short stitch length and/or thread the looper with 2 decorative threads.
- Pull seam flat.
- Stitch along all marked lines in this manner, one after the other.
- Embellish the other narrow edge of the scarf in the same manner.
- Finish each narrow edge with a closely spaced 3-thread overlock stitch, using the same colors as used for the flatlock stitch.
- Finish each long edge with a closely spaced 3-thread wide overlock stitch, using a contrasting color.
- **Note!** Always sew a sample first and set the differential feed so that you get a smooth edge.
