



1. Decorative eylet buttonholes (stitch no. 1.3.14) are stitched in a contrasting color.



2. Topstitch for an exclusive finish.

Embellish the seams with a decorative stitch (stitch no. 3.3.31 and stitch no. 3.3.32).



3. Decorate the belt loops with a stitch that has an antique hand made look (stitch no. 3.3.10).

Use the tapering function and sew or embroider to decorate the belt (stitch no. 1.1.7).

Add a professional touch to the belt with a piping in a contrasting color (use optional Narrow Piping Foot, part no. 820918096). Read more about the optional accessories and how to use them in the on-line Pfaff® Accessory Catalogue (www.pfaff.com).
